Diamond Head State Monument

The unique profile of Diamond Head (Lē'ahi) sits prominently near the eastern edge of Waikiki's coastline. Hawaii's most recognized landmark is known for its historic hiking trail, stunning coastal views, and military history. This broad, saucer-shaped crater was formed about 300,000 years ago during a single, explosive eruption that sent ash and fine particles in the air.

'Iolani Place

The official residence of Hawai^Di's monarchy, is a marvel of opulence, innovation and political intrigue. One can enjoy one of the most spectacular living restorations in all of Polynesia and immerse oneself in Hawai'i's royal heritage. Officially dedicated in 1882, 'Iolani Palace served as the setting for the monarchs and their courts on formal occasions.

Hanauma Bay Nature Preseve

A protected marine life conservation area, named after its unique curved bay, is a popular snorkeling spot in Hawaii. Formed within a volcanic cone on the eastern side of Oahu, this marine sanctuary is home to vibrant marine life and well-preserved corals.

Virtual Presentations are pre-recorded and added to the IAFOR Online Video Archive before the conference begins, where they remain indefinitely.






IAFOR Journals
